



JANUARY 2023 INCIDENTS DATA

15% OF INCIDENTS INVOLVED PHYSICAL THREATS

The CAM Antisemitism Research Center tracked **173 antisemitic incidents reported in the media worldwide in January 2023**, marking a daily average of 5.6 incidents. In all of 2022, CAM recorded a total of 1,921 incidents, or an average of 5.3 incidents per day.

January 2023 saw 98 incidents of far-right antisemitism (56.6% of total), as well as 12 (6.9%), 24 (13.9%), and 39 (22.5%) in the far-left, Islamist, and unidentifiable categories, respectively.

CAM also monitored 26 physical threats against Jews in January 2023, as well as 75 incidents of antisemitic vandalism.


TWITTER TOXICITY ANALYSIS

A new monthly Toxicity Analysis – published by the Combat Antisemitism Movement (CAM) in partnership with the Network Contagion Research Institute (NCRI) – has revealed the disturbing extent of antisemitic rhetoric and sentiment on Twitter.

Using a keyword bank (including the terms “Jew,” “Jews,” “Jewish,” “Judaism,” “Zionists,” “Zionism,” “ZOG,” “Kike,” and “Khazars”), a total

of 1.3 million tweets were collected in January, and a statistically significant random sample of 10,000 were indexed using a machine learning model.

The results showed 14% of the tweets were identity attacks on Jews, 11% were toxic toward Jews, 7% were insults to Jews, and 1% were threats against Jews.

Since Elon Musk’s Takeover, Twitter Has Seen a Rapid Rise in Gen-Z, Neo-Nazi Antisemitism, New Study Shows

A study by CAM and the Network Contagion Research Institute (NCRI) has demonstrated that extremist elements have viewed Elon Musk’s takeover of Twitter as an opportunity to rejoin the social media platform en masse. The study also indicates that a sea change is taking place on Twitter with respect to the proliferation of extremist antisemitic content.



Florida Sees Surge of Antisemitic Incidents in Recent Months, as Neo-Nazi GDL Leader Arrives in State

Recent months have seen a disturbing series of antisemitic incidents in Florida, including the projection of hateful images and words on prominent buildings in several cities across the Sunshine State. The surge of antisemitic incidents on Florida coincided with the arrival in the state of Jon Minadeo, head of the neo-Nazi Goyim Defense League.



CAM Encouraged by More Than 1,100 Entities Adopting IHRA Working Definition of Antisemitism

As of the end of December 2022, a total of 1,116 global entities have adopted and endorsed the IHRA Working Definition of Antisemitism. In 2022 alone, 91 new adoptions and endorsements were reported. And in the United States, 18 new states adopted it via legislation or executive actions in 2022, bringing the total number of states adopting this definition of antisemitism to 30.
