
MAY 2023 INCIDENTS DATA


15.2% of incidents involved physical threats

The CAM Antisemitism Research Center tracked 191 antisemitic reports worldwide in May 2023, marking a daily average of 6.2 incidents. In all of 2022, CAM recorded a total of 1,921 incidents, or an average of 5.3 incidents per day.

May 2023 saw 86 incidents of far-right antisemitism (45.1% of total), as well as 26 (13.6%), 50 (26.1%), and 29 (15.2%) in the farleft, Islamist, and unidentifiable categories. respectively.

29 physical threats against Jews, as well as 106 incidents of antisemitic vandalism, were monitored during the month of May.

CAM Responds to White House Strategy to Counter Antisemitism

CAM expressed appreciation for the White House's National Strategy to Counter Antisemitism and its "comprehensive, whole-of-government approach."

"We stress the strategy's reiteration that the United States has 'embraced' the Working Definition of Antisemitism put forth by the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance," CAM said. "The IHRA definition must be the sole and exclusive global standard for defining antisemitism."

New Report Examines Contemporary Antisemitism on US **College Campuses**

A new report released by the CAM Antisemitism Research Center and the Israel on Campus Coalition (ICC) examined the "Israel Apartheid Week" phenomenon and other anti-Zionist manifestations of Jewhatred at U.S. colleges and universities in 2023.

The study provides an overview of the weaponization of the "apartheid" claim by anti-Zionists, its role in fueling antisemitism on campuses, and the manner in which it negatively impacts Jewish students.



JAHM Recognized by More than 150 **Governors and Mayors Across Country**

Throughout May, 38 state governors and 135 mayors of cities across the U.S. officially recognized Jewish American Heritage Month (JAHM) - an indication of the growing awareness of the critical importance and timely relevance of this annual opportunity to highlight and celebrate Jewish contributions to U.S. society and educate the general public about Jewish culture, traditions, and history.

Among the many states and cities where CAM was active in promoting JAHM were Virginia, Oklahoma, New York City. Richmond, Palm Springs, Palm Beach County, Wichita, Rockford, and Highland Park.
