

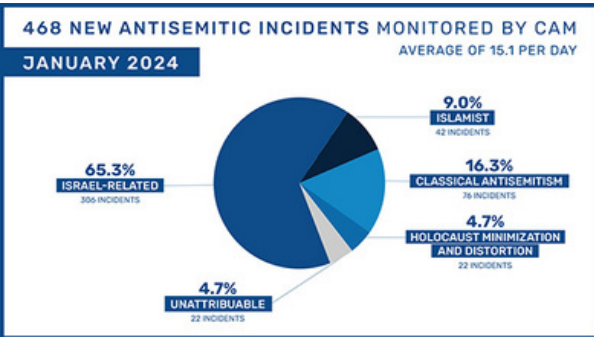
JANUARY 2024 INCIDENTS DATA

11.11% of incidents involved physical threats

The CAM Antisemitism Research Center (ARC) tracked 468 antisemitic reports worldwide in January 2024. This marked a daily average of 15.1 incidents, up 171% from the previous January.

January 2024 saw 76 incidents of classical antisemitism (16.3% of total), as well as 22 (4.7%) incidents of Holocaust distortion and minimization, 306 (65.4%) incidents of Israel-related antisemitism, 42 (9.0%) in the Islamist category, and 22 (4.7%) incidents were classified as unattributable.

52 physical threats against Jews, as well as 87 incidents of antisemitic vandalism, were also monitored.

New IHRA Definition Adoptions Report Analyzes Key Action in Fighting Antisemitism

A report tracking adoptions and endorsements of the IHRA Working Definition of Antisemitism in 2023, released by CAM, in partnership with the Center for the Study of Contemporary European Jewry at Tel Aviv University, revealed 97 new adoptions and endorsements in 2023.

As of December 2023 a total of 1,216 entities have adopted or endorsed the IHRA Working Definition of Antisemitism. Additionally, it was notable that American institutions of higher learning have been lacking in their embrace of the definition.



'Funding UNRWA Means Funding Terrorism, and This Runs Counter to America's National Principles and Interests'

In response to the U.S. House of Representatives Foreign Affairs Committee hearing on UNRWA, Combat Antisemitism Movement (CAM) Chief of Staff Arthur Maserjian issued the following statement:

"It is now abundantly clear to all that funding UNRWA means funding terrorism, and this runs counter to America's national principles and interests. The United States and its allies must cut funding for UNRWA completely and find alternative mechanisms to meet the humanitarian needs of Palestinian civilians."



Dramatic Escalation of Antisemitism Seen in Turkey in Wake of October 7th Attack

The CAM Antisemitism Research Center (ARC) detected and monitored a significant increase in antisemitic incidents in Turkey over the three months following the October 7th massacres.

Turkish President Erdoğan reached new levels of antisemitic rhetoric, describing Israeli PM Netanyahu as "worse than Hitler" and saying Israel was running "Nazi camps" for Palestinians. The torrent of antisemitism sweeping across Turkey is also being promoted by religious figures and state-controlled media outlets.
