
MARCH 2023 INCIDENTS DATA


10.2% OF INCIDENTS INVOLVED PHYSICAL THREATS

The CAM Antisemitism Research Center tracked 128 antisemitic reports worldwide in March 2023. marking a daily average of 4.1 incidents. In all of 2022, CAM recorded a total of 1,921 incidents, or an average of 5.3 incidents per day.

March 2023 saw 68 incidents of far-right antisemitism (53.1% of total), as well as 16 (12.5%), 27 (21.1%), and 17 (13.3%) in the far-left, Islamist, and unidentifiable categories, respectively.

CAM also monitored 13 physical threats against Jews in March 2023, as well as 53 incidents of antisemitic vandalism



TWITTER TOXICITY ANALYSIS

March's monthly <u>Toxicity Analysis</u> – published by CAM in partnership with the Network Contagion Research Institute (NCRI) – showed that toxicity scores for tweets mentioning Jews remained at similar levels to February.

The results — based on a statistically-significant random sample of 100,000 tweets out of 815,662 indexed using a machine learning model revealed 14% of the tweets were identity attacks on Jews, 6% were insults to Jews, and 1% were threats against Jews.

The tweets with the most engagement related to comparisons of the treatment of transgender people to Nazi persecution of the Jews; U.S. rapper Kanye West's declaration that he "likes Jewish people again"; and a series of posts by the Auschwitz-Birkenau Memorial Museum highlighting stories of Holocaust victims.

Jewish Leaders Say Only 16% Of European **Nations Have Lived Up** To Pledges To Fight **Antisemitism**

A year and a half after representatives of 37 European nations made commitments to combat antisemitism, only 16% of European Jewish leaders said they felt their countries had fully implemented those promises, a report released by the World Jewish Congress revealed.

The pledges were made at the Malmö International Forum on Holocaust Remembrance and Combating Antisemitism in 2021 in Sweden. A delegation from the WJC presented their study to Spain's Monarch, King Filipe VI.



Texas: CAM Adviser Elan Carr Urges Positive Approach to State-Level Fight Against Jew-Hatred

In a special briefing, Combat Antisemitism Movement (CAM) Advisory Board member Elan S. Carr offered the Texas Holocaust, Genocide, and Antisemitism **Advisory Commission** (THGAAC) a series of additional steps the state could take to address rising Jew-hatred.

Carr highlighted the importance of states and cities proclaiming and celebrating Jewish American Heritage Month, which falls annually during May, and developing programs to foster understanding of Jewish history and values.



Report Finds Antisemitism 'Higher Than Ever' On Twitter

The study by the Institute for Strategic Dialogue and CASM Technology found that hostile and discriminatory content towards Jewish people not only spiked after Elon Musk's takeover, but has remained at heightened levels ever since.

The report -- claiming to be the first to demonstrate a "persistent and notable elevation" of antisemitism on Twitter -- found that the volume of English-language antisemitic tweets more than doubled in the period following Musk's takeover.
